Dear residents, business owners,

Early this year, we informed you about the traffic lay-out changes at Kronenburg and Zonnestein. At that point we indicated that the new intersection at Zonnestein was going to be opened on Monday 4 May. By now, based on our experience with the changes at Kronenburg, we have decided to allow more time for the work at Zonnestein. As a result, the Zonnestein stop and the new traffic lay-out will be inaugurated on Monday 25 May. With this letter, we inform you about this.

Important in this context is the current situation regarding coronavirus. As it stands, VITAL is able to continue its work, with some additional measures. We are unable to predict with certainty whether or not additional obstacles will occur in the upcoming period. We will do our utmost to stick with the new planning.

The reconstruction results in a number of changing traffic situations, and unfortunately lots of inconvenience for road users. Please check the attached leaflet for more information about the traffic changes.

Temporary replacement minibus for pedestrians at Zonnestein

Until the reopening of the Zonnestein stop on 25 of May, public transport customers can use the Kronenburg and Onderuit stops. Ongoing cyclists and pedestrians can use the crossing at Kronenburg and the little tunnel for cyclists at Onderuit. In addition, pedestrians can use a temporary replacement minibus, free of charge. This little bus runs between Zonnestein (temporary stop at house numbers 101-129) and the Kostverlorenhof shopping centre (temporary stop close to Albert Heijn), with an extra stop close to the Kronenburg stop at Professor J.H. Bavincklaan (in the vicinity of the Ibis Budget and CityDen hotels). The free minibus runs seven days a week, every 12 minutes (five times per hour), between 9.00 and 21.00 hours. Because of coronavirus, the bus driver's seat will be separated from the rest of the minibus. The buses will also be cleaned regularly, using a disinfectant fluid.

The Amstelveen Line is part of the Amsteltram project. The implementation of the renewal is coordinated by the City of Amsterdam's Metro and Tram department, and is commissioned by Vervoerregio Amsterdam.

Additional consequences

- The work will be done during regular hours, Monday to Friday between 7.00 and 19.00 hours and also on Sunday 3 May and Sunday 24 May between 7.00 and 19.00 hours. If necessary, work will also take place on Thursday 21 May (Ascension Day).
- Minor work for the new tram stop will be done during the night from Sunday 3 into Monday 4 May, between 1.00 and 5.00 hours.
- The work will cause inconvenience in terms of noise, particularly because of the large amount of work traffic, and during the transport of prefab components, tarmacking, tarmac grinding and compressing soil and road foundations.
- There will be inconvenience for road users (including bus 55) because of the large number of changing traffic situations and possibly because of work traffic. VITAL will deploy traffic wardens where necessary.
- No specific inconvenience is expected in terms of dust and dirt. If there were to be inconvenience, VITAL will take measures to keep the roads clean.
- Emergency services will always have free passage.
